

Home Renovation Savings Program (HRSP)

Ontario Home Renovation Savings Program

The Home Renovation Savings Program (HRSP), in partnership with Enbridge Gas and Save on Energy, offers financial incentives to homeowners aiming to improve their home's energy efficiency.

Key Program Details:

Homeowners can access a range of rebates of up to 30 per cent for energy-efficient home improvements.

Eligible Projects:

Funds can be used for various energy-efficient upgrades, such as:

- Upgrading insulation, windows, and doors to improve energy efficiency.
- Installing energy-efficient heating systems and smart thermostats.
- Implementing air sealing measures to reduce energy loss.

Application Requirements & Home Energy Assessment Compliance

A home energy assessment may be required to determine eligibility and identify potential energy-saving opportunities. Homeowners must provide the necessary documentation, including building permits and proof of energy-efficient upgrades. All renovations must comply with local building codes and zoning regulations.

A home energy assessment is not required to receive the program rebates on heat pumps, solar panels, and energy storage.

Process:

- 1. Before beginning any renovation, fill out the online form at <u>www.homerenovationsavings.ca</u> to view a list of licensed Service Organizations in your area. Contact a Service Organization and complete an initial home energy assessment.
- 2. See which upgrades are recommended for your home and choose at least two to complete. To qualify for rebates, at least two eligible projects must be completed.

- 3. After upgrades and renovations are completed, a final assessment with the same registered energy advisor must be done.
- 4. Your rebates will be sent after your energy advisor submits all required documents.

Program Availability

The Home Renovation Savings Program is available to homeowners across Ontario. Eligibility criteria and rebate amounts may vary depending on the specific renovation project and location. Homeowners are encouraged to visit the official website or contact their local Enbridge Gas or Save on Energy representative for detailed information and guidance.
