Dear Minister Solomon,

These priorities align with TRREB's efforts to strengthen data and technology leadership for the real estate sector.

Through PropTx, TRREB's technology subsidiary, we are advancing this priority by supporting a broader and more connected real estate technology ecosystem. PropTx has grown from a regional MLS® data footprint into a broader provincial platform that includes most of Ontario's real estate listing data. It continues to evolve beyond the MLS® System itself through practical technology

solutions that support Members in their day-to-day business, including services such as PropTx Verify, The Habistat, Roomvo, SUPREME, and soon, Verified Transactions.

As AI becomes more embedded in professional services, TRREB believes that Canada's approach must protect the integrity of trusted data while encouraging innovation that improves the experience for professionals and consumers alike. The real estate industry will play an important role in demonstrating how AI can be adopted responsibly in a sector where transparency, consumer confidence, and data protection are fundamental.

TRREB would welcome the opportunity to collaborate with the federal government in support of the implementation of Canada's AI strategy. We look forward to scheduling a meeting with you to share our Members' perspectives as the government advances this important work under your leadership.
